## Service Bars, Reefers and Overcoats

## The Question

Are Service Tenure Insignias (aka "Service Bars") worn on the Reefer or the Overcoat?

## Comments

## No. Service Tenure Insignias are NOT worn on the Reefer or the Overcoat.

Uniform And Property U04-01, XI-H-2 (Uniform And Appearance Standards), states that ... "Upon completion of the below-listed periods of service, uniformed members are required to wear service bar(s) and/or star(s) on uniform outer garments with the exception of shirts, rainwear, leather jackets, wool overcoats, fleece jackets, quarterzip pullover, and sweaters authorized as an outer garment."

There are **two types of wool overcoats**, according to Uniform And Property U04-01-03 (Uniform Classifications) which lists the Reefer under the subheading of "Coat, 100% Wool" as an clothing item for Class A Uniforms. This should not be confused with another wool overcoat called the Overcoat, which is for lieutenants and above.



A **Reefer is made out of wool and it is an overcoat**, according to Uniform and Property U06-01-04 (Reefer). "Four button double-breasted reefer overcoat . . ."

A side note, a Reefer is NOT a Blouse. A Blouse is a <u>single-breasted coat</u> you would typically wear for graduation and award ceremonies. A <u>Reefer</u> is a <u>double-breasted overcoat</u> that will be heavier than a Blouse.

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
